# **Urines Samples**



If you suspect you have a urine infection please hand-in a sample as soon as possible. This will allow us to test the sample and pass to the Duty Dr, who will then contact you if you require further treatment. If your sample is tested and is negative and doesn't require treatment then no follow-up will be made. Red-top sample bottles, which contain a preservative powder, can be collected from reception.

# Results

The doctors look at all of the many results which come into the surgery every day and act on them accordingly; unless a specific arrangement has been made, you will not hear from us if the results of your tests are normal: no news is good news.



#### **Health Care Assistants (HCA) Clinics**

We have increased the number of Health Care Assistant clinics each week, and appointments can now be made on the mornings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. The HCAs can carry out a number of requests including blood tests, blood pressure checks, ear syringing and ECGs, as well as some dressings and stitch removals.

Recent update regarding GP's and Doctors: Although doctors are a recognised profession HM Passport Office no longer accepts your own GP as a counter-signatory. This is due to the high volume of people requesting the service and the pressure this puts on the very limited resources available to local surgeries. However if you know or have a friend that is a doctor this is still accepted. Countersignatures must either work in (or be retired in) a recognised profession, or be 'a person of good standing in their community'. These recognised professions range from an accountant to a barrister, as well as a funeral director or social worker.



# **Travel Vaccinations**



If you are planning a holiday please ensure you contact the Surgery at least <u>6 weeks before</u> your date of travel to allow us sufficient time to arrange any vaccinations required. Please follow the steps below when requesting travel vaccinations:

- 1. Complete the travel questionnaire which can be found on our website. Copies are also available for collection at reception.
- 2. The surgery will then contact you to arrange a telephone consultation with the nurse to discuss your requirements.
- 3. The nurse will call you at the arranged time and will inform you what vaccinations you require.
- 4. If you require NHS Vaccinations then an appointment will be made for you with the nurse to receive these. NHS vaccinations include diphtheria, polio & tetanus, typhoid, hepatitis A and cholera.
- 5. If you require non-NHS vaccinations, a prescription will be prepared for you to collect and source from a chemist. Once you have the vaccinations, you must then make an appointment with the nurse in order to have these administered (at least 2 weeks before travel). Please note that there is a charge for both the private prescription (£11) as well as the administration of the vaccine (£21). Non-NHS vaccinations include Hepatitis B, Rabies and Men ACWY.
